



Value-Added Practices Families Perceive are most Important at a Christian School

Apart from effective life/vocational preparation, the most important value-added practices that parents consider most important for a Christian school were teaching of traditional Christian values and beliefs, community service and Christian Studies programs in the school.



Parent Satisfaction with Christian School Communities


Parents at Christian schools viewed the community and relational emphasis of Christian schools as an area of strength and valued the strong alignment between their own expectations and perceptions of education with their school's expectations and priorities.





When determining schooling options for their children, 44% of Christian school parents would only consider other Christian schools and over a fifth of all parents (23%) did not consider any other school but the Christian school they enrolled in.


