Careers for the Future

A key part of our Vision Statement is for our students to "grow in grace and knowledge". This includes equipping them for future careers and opportunities. We also want students to understand their own voice and agency in the development of their futures. To support this, we have been seeking student input in meaningful ways about a variety of things.

Last week, our students were asked specifically about their ideas for Senior Schooling, and this provided us with very useful information on what our students actually want, their career goals and aspirations, and their preferred learning style. I have also been researching what trends and predictions there are for the future of employment in Australia, and I thought it might be also helpful to highlight some of the major trends they are predicting for our next generation.

According to the last lot of Employment Projections by the Australian Government, the largest 4 growing employment sectors are Health Care and Social Assistance, Accommodation and Food Services, Professional Scientific and Technical Services and Education and Training. These four industries account for over 60% of the growth in Australian Employment over the last couple of years and are predicted to continue growing.

Secondly, they predict that over 90% of all new jobs will require post-school education such as university, and that most of these jobs will require a high level of expertise. As such, we do encourage all our students to try and maintain their opportunities for further study after school, even if it is not in the immediate future.

Longer-term predictions for the future focus on these key areas as the major industries to grow; Healthcare, Construction, Education, Software, Data Anaylsis, Cybersecurity, E-commerce, Product Design, Digital Marketing and the Alternative Energy Sector. As you can see, technology remains one of the biggest driving factors and we must ensure we continue to develop these skills in our students.

We noticed many of these trends and interest areas were reflected in the students' subject preferences and want to ensure we are always reflecting, evaluating and looking forward to equip our students for the future. As such, we may make some changes in the next couple of years regarding what elective subjects we offer to support our students, how we deliver these subjects, and how we can tailor their experience to suit them individually. We want to support them to develop themselves for their chosen careers, and character development, but most importantly to grow in their knowledge and understanding of who they are and were created to be in Christ.




Year 7 Science




