Baptism and the Gift of Jesus

On the weekend, many of our school community got to witness the Baptism of Mr Dan and Mrs Amy Watson, and one of our senior students. I was so encouraged to hear their testimonies and see the power of Jesus transforming people's lives, and we feel privileged to be able to work and live in a school community that God uses to share his love with our community. We take no credit for anything, but we seek to honour the work of Jesus and the transforming power of the Holy Spirit.

Baptism ultimately is a sign for Christians that publicly, and personally demonstrates an individual's identification and total reliance on the grace of Jesus that was offered to us through the saving work of Jesus on the cross. Jesus took all our sin (things we have done, things we do and things we will do), died an agonising death, was buried for three days and rose again.

In Romans 6:3-4, the Apostle Paul explains it this way: Don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. This new life ultimately will be fully realised for eternity when either Jesus returns, or we are called home to Heaven. This place of ultimate perfection, without the propensity for wrong is what Christians ultimately look forward to.

God is the epitome of ultimate goodness, absolute perfection and untainted, unconditional and pure love. We could never measure up to that standard or even comprehend this level of perfection, and to try and reach it is exhausting. Since sin was introduced by Adam and Eve, humans now all have the propensity for right and wrong, in thought, action and deeds. Jesus offers us a way to rest in his perfection, and receive that pure untainted unconditional love as a gift. It cannot ever be earned. The freedom of not having to strive to reach perfection, but being fully able to rest in his, is a deep sense of peace that nothing on this earth can steal or destroy. Romans 8:38-39 puts it this way;

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

When Christians are baptised, we embrace and affirm this gospel message publicly that Jesus died for our sins, was buried, and lives again. Mrs Watson, on the day, shared in her testimony before her baptism of how God has transformed her life and given her such a peace and sense of belonging. She shared with us;

"Before Dan and I came to know Christ we were constantly searching for contentment, in all the wrong places. We moved towns multiple times, changed careers, and thought we needed better, cars, houses, holidays and a picture-perfect life to make us happy. The frustrating thing was none of these things that everyone else seemed to find happiness in ever seemed to make us happy. Our marriage was hanging by a thread, we were not coping with being parents or even coping with life in general.

... it wasn't until our move to Casino years later that we started to really discover who Christ really was. Firstly, I personally really did not want to move to Casino and the only reason I felt ok about moving was that I loved the feeling I got from the Christian School and so did Dan. The school would become one of the reasons we became Christians.....

Not long after that, we were invited to the Getting to Know God course (at Casino Christian School) and we quickly realised that it was Christ who was missing from our lives and who we had been searching for our whole lives.....

Finding Christ has truly set me free. So many of the things I once clung to have now little to no significance in my life. I don't feel like I have to please the world or fit into its standards anymore. I only have one person to please and that is God. There are so many other things God has done for me including bringing Dan and I closer in our love and understanding for each other. One thing I know is that there are going to still be hard or challenging days ahead, as we have had since becoming Christians; however, we now don't have to do the hard days alone, we have Christ to guide us through them."

What a gift we are all offered through our precious Jesus. It is available for all no matter your past. Have you accepted this gift for yourself? Would you like to know more? (parent name, signature, & date)


- Get on bus 7 in the afternoon and give that note to the driver.
